

i-law registration and access

THE WAY IN which staff and students at Nottingham Trent University register for and access the collection of journals and news services on the i-law platform has changed.


In place of the single username and password that all students and staff previously shared, individual registration is now required on the site – which requires that a **Nottingham Trent University** email address is used as part of the registration process.

This means that those with an existing i-law account need to generate an individual password that is associated with their existing NTU email address.

It also means that all staff and students needing access to material on the i-law platform will need to register for an individual account, using their NTU email address.

If you've already registered your email address with the i-law service

On the i-law.com login page, select the **Forgot Password** option (see illustration).





Next time you access the login page, enter your NTU email address and the password that you registered.





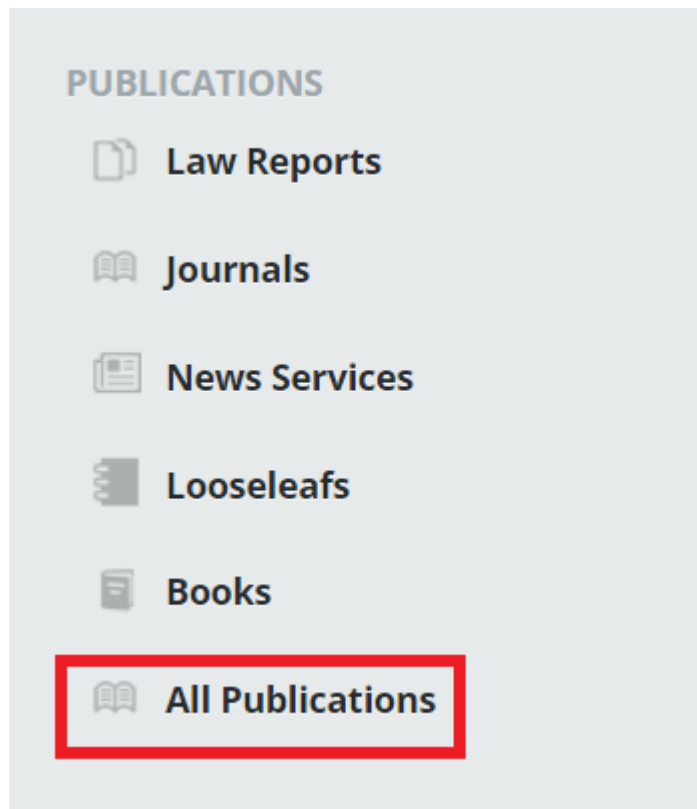
